## Living in Hacienda Heights

The area known as Hacienda Heights is located within unincorporated Los Angeles County. This means that as a resident of Hacienda Heights, you do not live in a city such as La Habra Heights or Whittier. Instead, your community is one of many in which the County is responsible for providing all municipal (local) services such as law enforcement, fire suppression, library, animal control, road maintenance, and park and recreation activities. The County Board of Supervisors is your "City Council" and is responsible for making policy that affects you and all other Hacienda Heights residents.

The County is divided into five Supervisorial Districts, each of which is represented by a Supervisor. In Hacienda Heights, all residential areas are part of the Fourth District. The Fourth District maintains a local field office in Rowland Heights with knowledgeable staff that can assist you in obtaining comprehensive information about County services. If you have questions or need assistance accessing County government services, please contact the Rowland Heights Field Office.

If you are planning a home improvement project such as a room addition, kitchen remodeling, or roof replacement, you should contact the La Puente Building and Safety Division of the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works (DPW). DPW will assist you with questions on any home or business project.

By law, most construction and installations require a building permit. The law is not intended to be a regulatory obstacle, but rather is in place for the safety and protection of homeowners, business owners, and their investments.

Many home and business owners are not aware of the various agencies that require approval before a building permit may be issued. Examples of County departments and agencies that may have requirements for your type of project are: Regional Planning, Fire Department, Health Services Department, School District, and other agencies, depending on the community.

The La Puente Building and Safety Office has a staff of professional engineers, building inspectors, and permit technicians that are happy to assist you in answering your questions. Please visit the office for assistance.

## Department of Regional Planning - Code Enforcement

The County of Los Angeles has a Zoning Ordinance that prohibits the following activities in Hacienda Heights and throughout the unincorporated areas of Los Angeles County:

- · Storage of junk and salvage items.
- Storage of inoperable vehicles.
- Parking of vehicles in the front yard.
- Parking of commercial vehicles on residentiallyzoned property.
- Operating an un-permitted business on residentially-zoned property.
- Using a trailer or recreational vehicle as living quarters.
- Conversion of garages to living quarters.
- Converting a single family dwelling unit to multiple dwelling units without Regional Planning's approval.
- Business signs such as banners and portable signs.
- Merchandise displayed and sold outside of an enclosed building.
- More than two yard sales per year per residence (see below).

The Department of Regional Planning enforces the Zoning Ordinance and cites violations of those described above. If you feel someone in your neighborhood is using their property contrary to the Zoning Ordinance, please call the Toll-Free Help Line at **(888) 924-4357.** 

### Yard or Garage Sale Ordinance - Things You Should Know

What better way to get rid of some of your unwanted old clothing, children's toys, and other household items than through a yard or garage sale? However, before you put that sign up and invite all the bargain hunters to your home, you should be aware of the following standards for conducting a yard or garage sale or other similar event in the unincorporated areas of the County.

- Items sold are limited to the personal property of the resident or residents of the dwelling where the sale is conducted.
- No items acquired for resale will be allowed to be sold.
- One sign, on-site and no longer than four (4) square feet, advertising the sale shall be allowed.
- The sign may be double sided and facing in both directions.
- Two personal property sales will be allowed yearly.
- Each sale is not to exceed three consecutive days.
- Each sale is allowed anytime except between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m.

Violations of these standards can be reported to the Zoning Enforcement Section of the Department of Regional Planning by calling the Help Line at (888) 924-4357.

## **Health Services - Environmental Health**

The Department of Health Services Environmental Health Division is responsible for protecting health and preventing disease by enforcing public health laws regarding food, water, housing, and the environment. Environmental Health conducts inspections of homes and investigates complaints related to vermin infestation, leaky plumbing, mold, lack of running water, un-maintained or unsanitary swimming pools, waste water discharge, broken windows, and damaged floors, walls, and ceilings. In addition to residential locations, Environmental Health inspects: restaurants; markets; bakeries; laundries, apartments; hotels/motels; swimming pools; and carnivals. ## **Food Vending on Streets**

In Hacienda Heights, it is illegal to sell food on public streets or sidewalks. If you buy food from someone selling out of their car or a shopping cart, you are putting yourself at risk of food poisoning. Protect yourself and your family from food poisoning by not buying food sold by street vendors. To file a complaint or request information call **(626) 430-5500**.

Animal Care and Control services to residents of Hacienda Heights are provided at the Baldwin Park Shelter. Services include pet adoptions, animal cruelty investigations, transporting injured animals for veterinary treatment, barking dog complaints, dangerous dog investigations, patrolling for stray animals, issuing pet licenses, and picking up stray/ dead animals.

Monday through Thursday:12:00 Noon to 7:00 p.m.Fridays and Saturdays:10:00. a.m. to 5:00 p.m.Sundays and holidays:ClosedEmergency services are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Pet owners are encouraged to visit the shelter in person to identify lost pets. Proof of ownership is required. The shelter also has many animals for adoption. If you are considering bringing a pet into your family, please consider a shelter pet. Low cost vaccination and licensing clinics for dogs and cats (yes, cats need a license too) are also available at the Baldwin Park Shelter. ## **Consumer Affairs - Consumer Tips**

- Ask stores about their refund policy.
- Save your receipts and compare product warranties.
- If you buy on credit, don't sign a contract you don't understand.
- Don't be afraid to ask questions: How much is the total amount you will pay, including interest? When will the first and subsequent payments become due?
- When buying on the Internet, make sure the website is secure before you enter personal information and examine the seller's shipping and handling fees and return and cancellation policies.

#### Protect Yourself From Exposure to Mosquito Infections



Avoid outdoor activities at dawn and dusk during the mosquito season (May to October). This is particularly important for the elderly and small children.

Wear long pants and long sleeve shirt and apply insect repellant when outside.

Make sure that doors and windows have tight-fitting screens. Repair or replace screens that have tears or holes in them.

Drain all standing water on your property and stock permanent ponds with fish that eat mosquito larvae. You may obtain this fish from your local mosquito and vector control agency below.

Make sure roof gutters drain properly. Clean clogged gutters in the spring and fall.

Emergency Preparedness Network – Provides timely information to the community on emergency preparedness. Vital Intervention and Directional Alternatives (VIDA). Program for at-risk youth ages 11 to 17 years. Youth Community Center – Provides after school programs for children 8 years and up.
