

HACIENDA HEIGHTS MILITARY RECOGNITION BANNER PROGRAM



To honor the dedicated service of Hacienda Heights residents proudly serving in the United States Armed Forces, the Board Office and the San Gabriel Valley Regional Chamber of Commerce began displaying recognition banners along major streets of the community. The "Heights Military Recognition Banner Program" seeks to honor active military personnel by having a banner in their name prominently displayed on utility and light poles. Residents of Hacienda Heights who are on active duty are eligible to participate in the program and receive a banner. The first group of approximately 54 banners were installed last year and will be left up indefinitely. In Hacienda Heights they can be found on Hacienda Boulevard and Colima Road, and are planned for Haliburton

NEW ELECTRONIC MONUMENT SIGN INSTALLED IN HACIENDA HEIGHTS

You may have noticed the new electronic sign welcoming motorists into Hacienda Heights on Hacienda Boulevard at Halliburton Road. The recently completed sign includes a community message board which will display important County information to motorists passing through your community.

TIPPING FEES WILL SUPPORT COMMUNITY PROJECTS

The Tipping Fee Project originates from a trust fund dedicated to Hacienda Heights established as part of the Puente Hills Landfill expansion. Local residents have participated in a series of meetings to discuss how these set aside funds will benefit the Hacienda Heights community. Some of the exciting projects include:

High School Pools

The County of Los Angeles has approved funding of up to \$1.5 million for the Los Altos High School pool replacement and Wilson High School pool rehabilitation projects. Work is expected to begin on the Los Altos High School pool in 2008 and the Wilson High School pool project will follow. This funding will result in enhanced public access to these pools during non-school hours.

Hillgrove Community Center

The Hillgrove Learning Center site, located on Turnbull Canyon Road and the Pomona (60) Freeway, was identified as a potential site for a new multi-use community facility. The community will continue to participate in planning meetings over the next few months as the County of Los Angeles and the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District move forward on this exciting community resource project.

Orange Grove Open Space

Plans are underway to convert a vacant area of Orange Grove Elementary School into a local community passive park.

NEW BUS STOP BENCHES and TRASH CONTAINERS



New wrought iron advertising benches will soon be installed and will include the Hacienda Heights community name. Advertising bench companies anticipate completing the installation of new wrought iron advertising benches by summer 2008. New wrought iron trash containers are also planned for every bus stop in Hacienda Heights and the Department of Public Works anticipates installation will be complete in Fall 2008. This is all part of the County's ongoing efforts to enhance the streets in unincorporated communities. If you see a bus stop that requires maintenance or has excess trash, call (626) 458-3961.

VETERANS BENEFIT FROM COUNTY EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

A Veteran of the Army National Guard has become the first permanent employee hired by Los Angeles County through a program providing employment and internship opportunities to Veterans. Created by the Board of Supervisors, the Veterans Internship Program is available to local military veterans who have been honorably discharged. Participants are hired into paid internships in various County departments, which will enable them to compete for permanent County positions. A total of fifty veterans have been placed by the program and are currently working in internships across the County. Interested Veterans are encouraged to visit

FREE ACCESS TO COUNTY FACILITIES FOR VETERANS WITH SPECIAL LICENSE PLATES

To express gratitude to those veterans of distinguished service, parking fees will be waived at any County-operated park and beaches parking lots. Valid license plates include the Congressional Medal of Honor, Legion of Valor, Purple Heart, Prisoners of War, Survivors of Pearl Harbor, and Disabled Veterans. The waiver is not valid on weekends and holidays, other than Veterans Day.

UPGRADES TO LOCAL PARKS

STEINMETZ PARK

New play area equipment was installed in January 2008. It has accessible swings and consists of a shade cover, double sliding board and a teeter totter. Wood chips surround the structures to keep children from becoming injured. The play area is for youth ages 2 to 5 years. A larger play structure for youth ages 5 to 12 years will be completed by Summer 2008.

PEPPERBROOK PARK

New play structures were installed for youth ages 2 to 5 years old. The equipment features a tube slide and swings.



SCHABARUM COUNTY PARK

The 589-acre Schabarum Regional County Park will undergo three refurbishment projects in 2008. Look forward to a new rest area for equestrians along the multi-use trail on the east end of the park in Summer 2008. The rest area will be landscaped and include hitching posts and watering stations. Also, new play area equipment for the kids is scheduled to be installed this Summer. Pedestrian bridges along with two vehicles bridges will also be refurbished and are scheduled to be completed early Winter 2008.

"RESTAURANT SUMMIT" TRAINING OFFERED TO AREA FOOD RETAIL OWNERS and OPERATORS

The Environmental Health Division of the Department of Public Health conducted a Food Safety Training Workshop on May 22, 2008, at the Happy Harbor Restaurant in Rowland Heights. The workshop was open to Hacienda Heights proprietors and provided information on County restaurant regulations, inspections, and the new California Retail Food Code. HACIENDA HEIGHTS COMMUNITY PLAN UPDATE AWARD WINNING RESULTS

The Hacienda Heights Community Plan Update received the 2008 Public Outreach Award from the American Planning Association. Facilitated by the Department of Regional Planning, the Community Plan Update included a series of community meetings and events in which the community developed a vision of the future for Hacienda Heights, exploring issues such as housing, community services, maintenance, open space and youth. The Draft Plan is scheduled to be

TRASH COLLECTION FRANCHISE UPDATE

A new franchise waste collection system for Hacienda Heights is expected in Spring 2009. This new system will provide residents with additional services such as extra containers for recycling and green waste, bulky item collections twice per year, special community cleanup events, excess green waste collection, free rollout services for the elderly and/or disabled, and senior discounts for qualifying seniors.

MANAGING TRAFFIC SIGNALS

Within the next year, the Hacienda Heights area will have 23 traffic signals added to the County's central traffic management system. The signals are located along Gale Avenue, Colima Road, Hacienda Boulevard, and Azusa Avenue. The traffic management system will allow the traffic engineers to analyze troubled areas for timing improvements and give maintenance staff alerts to intersection problems. This project is scheduled for completion by Fall 2008.





NEW LAW REGULATING CELLPHONE USE

The Los Angeles County Departmeent of Public Health reminds you that effective July 1, 2008, California Law:

- Prohibits the use of "hand-held" cell phones among drivers 18 years and older, except for emergency calls to law enforcement and public safety agencies, and for certain commercial vehicles for which the law's effective date is July 1, 2011.
- Prohibits a driver under the age of 18 years from using any wireless device, even if equipped with a hands-free or mobile service device, except during an emergency.

DIGITAL TELEVISION

In less than a year, the country will change the way it sends television signals. Here's what you need to know.

- If all of your TVs are hooked up to cable or satellite, you will continue to get your TV after the switch. Check with your cable or satellite company to be sure.
- If you have a digital TV, you are ready for the switch. (If your TV is more than 10 years old it probably is not digital. If it is less than 10 years old, ask the manufacturer if your TV is "analog-only.")
- If you have an analog-only TV with a roof top antenna or "rabbit ears," you will need to purchase a "converter box."



SAFELY SURRENDERED BABY LAW PROGRAM

The Safely Surrendered Baby Law Program

allows a parent, or anyone with lawful custody, to surrender a newborn child (72-hours or younger) to any fire fighter on duty at any fire station or to any hospital staff at a hospital in Los Angeles County. The purpose of the law is to protect



newborns from being hurt or killed because they were abandoned. As long as the baby has not been abused or neglected, the person may surrender the baby without fear of arrest or prosecution for child abandonment.

ADOPT-A-PET




If you are considering bringing a pet into your family, please consider a shelter pet. Adoption fees are \$33 for cats and \$38 for dogs. Fees include the pets initial vaccinations, spay, neutering cost, and microchip.

Every pet owner is required to follow these laws:

- The Leash Law It is not permitted to let your dog run loose day or night, with or without a license.
- Rabies Vaccination Requirements Rabies vaccinations must be kept current for all dogs and cats.
- Annual Licensing Requirements A license tag must be purchased annually for dogs and cats and must be secured to their collar.
- Providing Animals Proper Shelter Animals must have access to shelter from rain and sun at all times.
- Providing Animals Food and Water Failing to provide an animal with adequate food or water is punishable by the State Penal Code.
- Transporting Animals It is not permissible to transport any dog in the back or bed of any open truck or other open vehicle while traveling on a County road, street, highway, lane or alley.
- Anti-Tethering With few exceptions, no person shall tether, fasten, chain, tie, or restrain, a dog to a tree, fence, dog house or any other stationary object.
- Mandatory Spay/Neuter & Microchip Ordinance-All dogs must be spayed or neutered and microchipped unless the pet is qualified for an "exemption".

BRUSH CLEARANCE



On August 21, 2007, the Los Angeles County Fire Department responded to a greater alarm brush fire in Hacienda Heights. Approximately 100 acres burned and over 300 firefighters responded. Fortunately, due to an aggressive fire attack on the ground and in the air, there were no injuries or loss of property.

The Los Angeles County Fire Department has begun annual residential brush inspections. Please follow these simple tips to lower the risk of a brush fire at your property:

- Remove flammable vegetation and other combustible growth within 30 feet of any structures
- Landscape drought-tolerant and fire-resistant plants
- Space trees and shrubs a minimum of 15 feet apart (or three times their diameter) from other shrubs
- Remove dead branches, leaves and all stacks of combustible materials
- Stack wood at least 30 feet from structures
- Remove flammable vegetation within 10 feet of wood piles

Coyotes are often sighted in Hacienda Heights. There are several steps you can take to discourage coyote visits on your property.



- Never leave small children unattended in areas where coyotes are known to be, even in your yard.
- Keep small pets indoors. Some coyotes hunt cats in residential areas. Keep pet food indoors, or promptly remove dishes when pets complete their meal outside.
- Outdoor lights with motion sensors may keep coyotes from your property at night.
- · Clear brush and dense weeds from around your property. This deprives rodents of shelter, and reduces cover for coyotes who search for rodents for food.
- Maintain trash cans with secure lids that will not open if tipped over by large animals. Do not leave filled plastic trash bags out at night. Try and avoid putting out your trash the night before pick-up. Put trash out the morning to prevent coyotes from scavenging during the evening.
- Do not feed or provide water for coyotes or other wildlife. It is against the law to feed coyotes.

Public Works administers the street lighting program funded through property tax assessments. Southern California Edison (SCE) installs the street lights and responds to maintenance calls.

Upon receipt of a street lighting request, DPW will:

• Determine if your area is part of an existing County Lighting District.

- If you are not part of the district, DPW will prepare a petition for a community member to circulate among the affected property owners. Annual assessments are \$5 per home, with higher rates for other land uses.
- Once the petition is returned and signed by a set majority of the property owners and verified by DPW, then a formal ballot proceeding is begun. The ballots are then sent out to the property owners within the petition area. If a majority of the ballots are returned in opposition to being part of the district, then the proceeding ends. Otherwise, the territory becomes part of the district and street lights are generally installed by SCE within 4 to 6 months.

Make sure your horse is protected against West Nile Virus. It is important to take preventive actions early. Contact a veterinarian for more information about vaccination.

Swimming Pools

Caution: Swimming pools that are not maintained can become a mosquito-breeding site, as well as a potential drowning hazard for children. To report a swimming pool hazard contact the Office of Environmental Health at (626) 813-3360.

Pandemic Flu - Avian Influenza (Bird Flu)

A pandemic is a global disease outbreak which occurs when a new virus emerges for which there is little or no immunity in humans, and begins to cause serious illness worldwide. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention stated there have been no human cases of avian influenza in the United States and no Americans have been found to have been infected abroad. The current risk to the United States population from the avian influenza outbreak is low. Recent outbreaks have occurred in Asia, Europe, and Africa.




- 1. Verify that your business is a permitted use based on the property's zoning.
- 2. Check with Regional Planning to verify whether there are any zoning violations in the commercial center. Regional Planning cannot accept or approve your application until all violations have been abated at the location.
- 3. Verify that there is sufficient parking and whether your business will require additional parking. If the parking needs from existing legal businesses already reach or exceed the number of parking spaces allowed, you need to obtain additional approvals from Regional Planning. Any of these issues may delay opening your business even if you have already signed your lease with the property owner.
