# Community Updates

## Hacienda Heights Community and Recreation Center

1234 Valencia Avenue

Through a partnership with the Hacienda La Puente Unified School District, the County of Los Angeles will begin construction this year on the new Hacienda Heights Community and Recreation Center. The 19,000 square foot facility will be constructed at the 7-acre site of the former Hillgrove Elementary School and will offer Hacienda Heights residents a variety of educational, social and recreational programs. Utilizing funds dedicated by the Board of Supervisors, the Community Development Commission (CDC) is managing the development and construction of the facility designed by DLR Group WWCOT Architects. The Department of Parks and Recreation will manage the facility which is scheduled to be completed in the latter part of 2013. For more information contact (909) 594-6561.

### *“Circles of a Ripple”* See front cover

Included on the grounds of the new community center will be a new civic art project entitled “Circles of a Ripple”. This open space area will provide visitors an opportunity to relax and reflect around two existing and unique Linden Trees. Located on the east portion of the property, Artist James Dinh’s design will include four circular layers identifying the physical landscape and cultural makeup of Hacienda Heights. Two community workshops were held to obtain feedback on the project and residents were asked to submit old photographs from the area for the historical timeline. Construction is expected to begin in mid-2012 and is scheduled to be completed in the latter part of 2013.

*Circle of Land:* Makes up the outermost circle of the project representing the topography of Hacienda Heights and the Puente Hills.

*Circle of Ecologies:* Connects visitors to the local native landscape.

*Circle of Time:* Incorporates Hacienda Heights’ rich history through a timeline containing local historical figures and photos.

*Circle of Wishes:* Open space within the project that will invite visitors to reflect and enjoy the surroundings.

## Orange Grove Park in the Works

14517 Orange Grove Avenue

A new park is coming to Hacienda Heights! Construction will begin this year on a 5-acre passive park that will transform a dirt field into a seasonally landscaped green space that local residents can enjoy year-round. The park will be funded by the County of Los Angeles and developed by CDC in partnership with the Hacienda La Puente School District. Located next to Orange Grove Elementary School, the park will offer a walking trail, exercise areas, children’s play area, picnic tables and landscaping that includes drought tolerant and seasonally blooming native plants. The park will also offer stunning views of the San Gabriel Mountains in the distance.

Orange Grove Park will be managed by the Department of Parks and Recreation. Construction is scheduled to be completed by the Fall of 2013.

## Citrus Tree Disease Detected in Hacienda Heights

A deadly plant disease called Huanglongbing (HLB), also known as citrus greening disease, has been found in your area and could be a death sentence for backyard citrus trees. The disease is spread by a pest called the Asian citrus psyllid. In

order to save our citrus, you should:

- **Keep Homegrown Citrus at Home.** Your area is under quarantine. Reduce the spread of citrus diseases by not moving your homegrown citrus fruit or plants out of quarantine areas.
- **Inspect Citrus Plants Regularly.** Symptoms of the disease include yellow mottling of the leaves, lopsided fruit and excessive fruit drop. Psyllids and eggs are typically found on new shoots.
- **Check Citrus Plant Suppliers.** Only buy citrus plants from a reputable, licensed California nursery.
- **Avoid Fines and Penalties.** If you knowingly purchase citrus in violation of quarantine regulations and requirements, the penalties could range from \$1,100 to \$60,000 per violation.

## Nogales Street Grade Separation

Waiting for a passing train at train crossings can be frustrating! The Alameda Corridor East Construction Authority (ACE), in conjunction with the Department of Public Works and the City of Industry, is completing design on a grade separation project on Nogales Street at the Union Pacific Railroad crossing. The project will enhance safety, reduce traffic congestion, and improve emergency response. ACE estimates that construction will begin mid-2012 and will take approximately three years to complete.

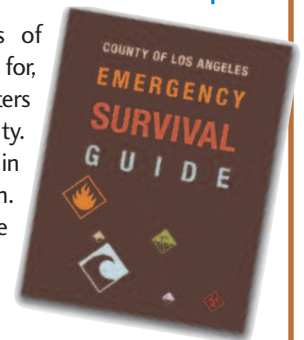

### Colima Road Project

Years of winter rains have taken its toll on a portion of Colima Road in Hacienda Heights along the residential hillside between Casino Drive and Camino Del Sur. Slope failure resulted in damage to the backyards of two private residences, and the public right-of-way. A groundwater control program will add drains into the slope and a concrete retaining wall will be constructed. These repairs will increase the stability of the slope and provide protection for the roads and private properties adjacent to the hillside. Repairs will be completed in the Fall of 2012.

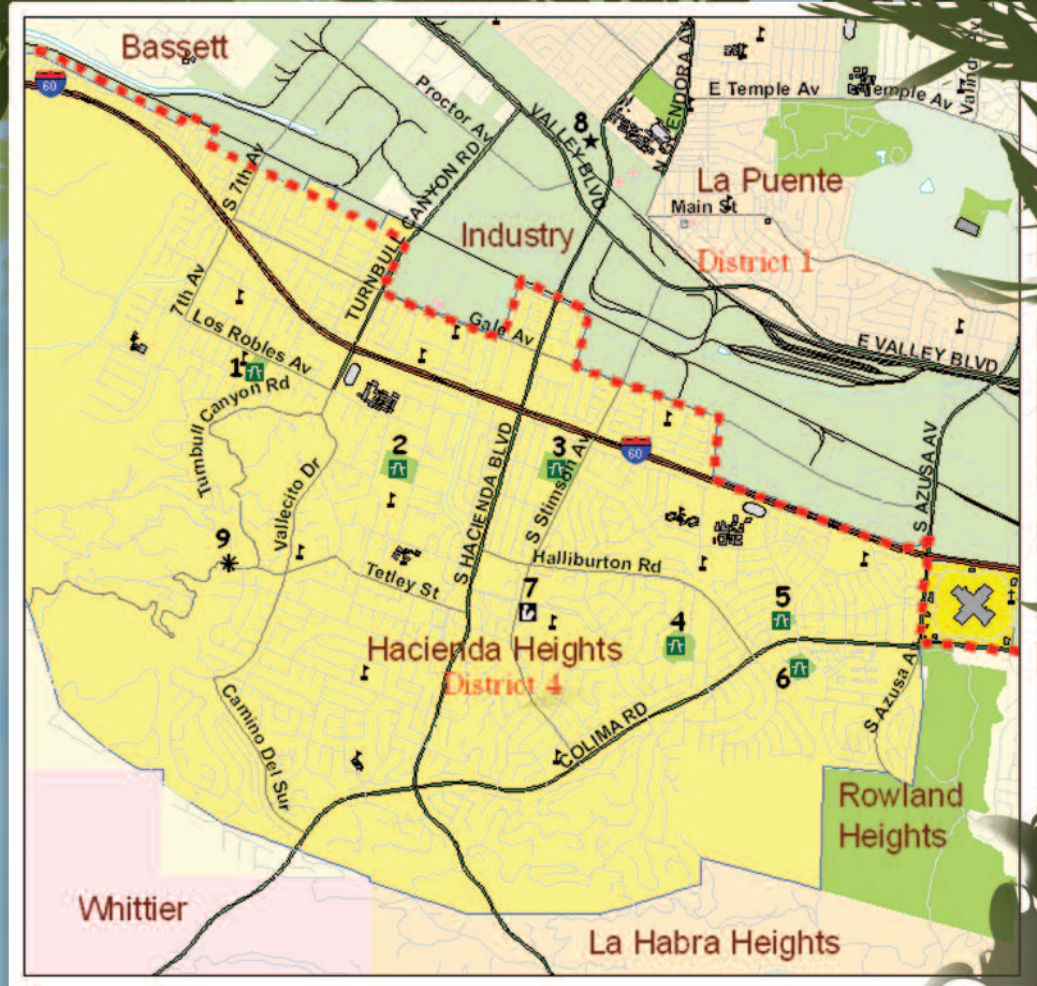
